Who is my roommate?

Can I have a vehicle on campus and must I register it?

Resident and commuter students are permitted to have a car on campus, but **must** register for a parking permit from Public Safety. A Message from The Wellness Center

It is a **College Requirement** that all new students have a physical exam (LBC Physical Exam Form to be filled out by your health care provider) and submit a completed Health Form (filled out by student) to The Wellness Center prior to the start of the semester. The exam needs to be within the last year. **Failure to do so will prohibit you from registering for classes and moving into the resident halls**.

Also, Pennsylvania State Law **requires** that all students residing in dorms must have a onetime vaccination against meningococcal disease, or have a signed waiver requesting exemption from the vaccination.
